Some of the sessions included Polymers in your World, Smelly Stuff, Fluorine, Mail Fraud and Gadgets, and Intro to Programming. Commando Nations!


Our WHS artist in residence has been working with student council to rebrand the previosuly named Commando Clans. With a focus on Canadian animal totems, new icons are being designed for each Nation.

In December, the new Commando Nations will be announced to our students, bringing groups together from different grades for cooperative play, friendly competition, and mentorship.

One of the measures BTPS uses to report on the assurance measures is identified under Learning Supports as Safe and Caring.
